








- 1959 First ddb entered America



Three types of profiles in dogs

■ 1. STRAIGHT

- i.e. Irish Setter
- Skull-Muzzle parallel planes
- Medium thickness skin
- Feet are in Parallel planes





2. CONVEX

- i.e. Whippet, Greyhound
- Skin very thin
- Feet turn in
- Extremities are fine, tapering

Third type of profiles in dogs

- 3. CONCAVE
 - i.e. Bulldog
 - Dipping topline
 - Skin is thick
 - Toes out (in front)
 - Extremities are thick
 - Has to have bone






■ The DDB nature is CONCAVE


General Appearance

Size, Proportion & Substance

- Dogs: 23.5 27 inches
- Dogs: at least 110 lbs
- Bitches: 23 26 inches
- Bitches: at least 99 lbs




Important Proportions





- Length of body is greater than height at withers, in the proportion of 11/10
- The depth of chest is more than half the height at the withers
- Circumference of head equals the height at withers for males, bitches may be slightly less.

Head





- Trapezium shape from above & front
 - Large & Broad





Oval & set wide apart

Eyes



Space between eyes is =2x the length of eye



Too Light – Not preferred





Fault – Protruding Eyes Round – Not preferred



Ears





- Darker in color
- Should not reach beyond eye

Incorrect Ear Placement

Front edge should be close to cheek














Small Ears/Rose Ears

Skull

Trapezoid shape when viewed from above & front.









- Prominent cheeks
- Well developed eyebrows

Stop





Very pronounced



■ Almost right angle (95-100 degrees)

Muzzle


- Square when viewed from above
- Slightly concave
- Length varies from 1/4 to 1/3 of the total length of the head








Wrinkle & Expression

Expression

Nose

- Broad
- Well opened nostrils
- Self colored according to mask color
- Slightly upturned







Upper Lip

- V shaped
- Thick
- Moderately pendulous












Jaw





- Very powerful & broad
- Lower jaw curves upwards
- Chin is pronounced



Bite & Teeth





■ Undershot ■ Strong teeth ■ Well aligned

SEVERE FAULT – canines constantly visible when mouth is closed



Fault – incisors visible when mouth is closed

More Head Types










Incorrect Head Diagram

- 1. Correct Head & proportions
- 2. Too much underjaw
- 3. Lacking chin mark
- 4. Down-faced muzzled (roman nose)
- 5. Muzzle too short
- 6. Muzzle too long, stop not pronounced



Heads that need improvement



Hyper-typical head



Needs more cheek & wrinkle



Ears too big & undershot too much



Prefer more stop



Too Square & lacking chin



Needs more back skull, cheek & wrinkle

Severe Fault







■ Long, narrow head with insufficiently pronounced stop, with a muzzle measuring more than a third of the total length of the head (lack of head type).



Neck



- Almost cylindrical
- Slightly convex furrow at the junction of head/neck
- Broad at base
- Well defined dewlap



Topline






- Solid & Broad when viewed from above
- Withers well marked

Chest

- Deep & broad
- Let down lower than elbows
- Forechest is convex
- Ribcage is well sprung






 Circumference of chest should be between 10-12 inches greater than the height at withers

Chest Faults

Hollow chest





Lacking depth of chest/too leggy



Lack of forechest



Overdone



Bulldoggy



Underline & Croup

- Slight to Moderate tuck-up
- Curved from the brisket to abdomen






Moderately sloping croup


Tail

- Prefer tip reaches to hock
- Carried level or slightly raised in movement









■ Fault – fused vertebrae



Incorrect Tail Carriage

- Standing on Left
- During movement on Right





■ Fault – check for fused vertebrae





Body Faults

Roach topline



Prefer stronger topline



Slope in croup is too much

Short in body





Forequarters



Very muscular



Strong bone structure

Shoulders & Front Angulation





- Slant of shoulder blade = about 45 °
- Angle of scapular-humeral articulation = little more than 90 °

Too straight

Front Angulation – incorrect



Short in upper arm




Prefer more angulation

Front

- Arms muscular
- Elbows in line with body
- Forearms straight or inclining inwards





Pasterns & Feet

- Powerful pasterns may bend slightly outwards
- Feet Strong with tight toes
- Front dewclaws are permitted

Good example - Stacked




Good example - Natural



Hindquarters

- Powerful & strong
- Parallel when viewed from behind
- Not as broad as forequarters

- Thigh well developed & muscled
- Stifle Parallel to median plane. Well angulated.
- 2nd thigh short & muscled






Hocks

- Short & sinewy
- Joint –moderately open
- Strong
- No dewclaws





Rear Angulation - incorrect

Too straight





Over 4 angulated



Hyper-extended hock

Coat & Color

- Skin is thick & loose fitting
- Coat is fine, short & soft





- Degrees of fawn
- Isabella Mahogany
- Richer color preferred


Mask Color

Right examples are too invasive – not preferred

White Markings

Limited white patches are permitted on chest & extremities of limbs.






Excessive White

Examples of excessive white on chest/neck





Fault – White on tip
of the tail or on
the front part of
the forelegs.





Gait

- Lion like
- Drops head
- Topline inclines towards the front
- Front feet get closer to the median plane



Side Gait



■ Good extension of forelegs ■ Good drive from hindquarters

Young dogues go through a "gangly" phase



- Male example
 - 6 months
 - 11 months
 - 2 1/2 years
- Rear grows first
- Chest drops last


Females mature at a slow rate as well

- Guardian
- Companion
- Calm & balanced
- Males dominant




Disqualifying Faults



Not undershot



Wry jaw



Disqualifying Fault

Atrophied tail or twisted tail (kink)





Disqualifying Fault


White on head/body or any other color than fawn





Form & Function

- Guarding looks dissuasive
- Hunting athletic
- Fighting thick skin folds






Judging the DDB

- Leave plenty of room between dogs
- Noises are common (snorts/grunts)
- Aloof in character
- Expect drool
- Heat sensitive



The DDB vs. The Bullmastiff







- Bigger head
- More wrinkles
- Nose turned up
- Black mask differs
- More bulldog characteristics





Bullmastiff has...

- More leg
- Congruent line from head to tail

DDB is...

- Longer in body
- More angulated
- Wider in front than rear



Working Ability

- Obedience
- Agility
- Carting
- Rally







More Working Ability



- Therapy
- Weight Pulling
- Search & Rescue
- Narcotic detection


