

### English Toy Spaniel Breed History

- Toy spaniels originally referred to as comforter spaniell or spaniell gentile
- First recorded history in 1570 by Dr.Caius
   personal physician to Elizabeth I
- Breed prominence during the reign of the Stuart kings
  - Charles I and Charles II.
- Common name of "King Charles Spaniel" or "Charlie" given to breed in honor of Charles II
- Recognized officially as King Charles Spaniel in every country, but US
- Breed origin as a result of crosses with the



Continental Spaniel by the Bulldog, Pug, Japanese Spaniels and Pekingese

### English Toy Spaniel Breed History

- Breed popularity peaked during Edwardian period
- Massive global decline in breed population leading up to World War II
  - In UK, many dogs were put down for fear of raids, as well as, lack of food
- (1886)- First Toy Spaniel registered in US
- (1892)- English Toy Spaniel breed officially recognized by the AKC
- (1895- 1899)- Breed popularity peaked in US
- (1925-1950)- Breed popularity plummeted in US to level of only a handful of breeders
- (1955-1960)- Breed numbers so few that there was threat the AKC would rescind breed recognition

## English Toy Spaniel Varieties

- Two (2) Varieties/ Divided by color alone
- King Charles & Ruby (KC&R)
  - Referred to as Solids or Solid Colors
  - King Charles = Black and Tan
  - Ruby = Red
  - Only allowable white is a small (quarter-sized) patch on the chest
- Blenheim & Prince Charles (B&PC)
  - Referred to as Brokens or Broken Colors
  - Blenheim = Red & White
  - Prince Charles = Tri-color (Black & White with tan points)
  - Both comprised of a pearly white ground color broken with patches of red or black
  - Pearly white is an iridescent white not an ice white
  - Note: There is no Black & White coloration



### English Toy Spaniel Breed Standard

- Balance
  - Compact, cobby dog with big round head
- · Head (Large in comparison to size of dog)
  - Dome
  - Nose placement



- Eyes
- Muzzle/ Jaw
- Ear Set
- · Body
  - Square in all proportions
  - Long, straight coat
  - Bone
- Movement
  - Strong & Forward
- Temperament
  - Sophisticated, Aloof
  - Happy, Proud, Confident




# English Toy Spaniel Breed Standard- Balance


- · A compact, cobby and essentially square toy dog
- A large, domed head, short laid back nose, lustrous round dark eye, and a well-cushioned face leading to a soft expression
- · The ETS is a head breed- the head makes the ETS different
- The most important characteristics of the breed are exemplified by the head




#### English Toy Spaniel Breed Standard- Ideal Head



















































- Straight legs
- Strong pasterns



# English Toy Spaniel Body- Hindquarters

- · Nicely angulated rear
- · Well-muscled rear
- Hocks are parallel to one another
  - perpendicular to the ground
- Should stand square on four legs



# English Toy Spaniel Body- Additional Considerations

- Back- Broad with good rib spring
- Topline- Level with the tail coming off the back




- · Coat- Straight, Silky, Long
- · Tail- Docked 2-4 inches
  - Many are born with a short or "screw tail" which is acceptable
  - Feathering on tail should be 3-4 inches in length
  - Referred to as a flag
- Bone- Moderate-to-Heavy
- Size- Ideal is 12 –14 lbs
  - All things being equal, smaller is preferred



### English Toy Spaniel Movement

- Good reach and length of stride
  - Exhibited on side gait
  - Elegant and controlled
- Sound driving rear
  - Evident of stable and correct construction
- · Straight and true movement
  - Coming and going

NOTE: Breed origins is as lap dog; no gaming, herding or flushing heritage

#### Temperament

- Interested and affectionate
- Aloof and haughty
  - denoting their royal heritage

NOTE: A Toy Spaniel should never be aggressive








# English Toy Spaniel Judging Examination

- Never examine ETS on the ground or stand over ETS in a ring
- When assessing bite, never pry open or into an ETS mouth
  - Slide thumb or finger over lower jaw
  - If questionable, ask exhibitor to open mouth to view bite
- In large entries and after individual examinations, ask exhibitors to pick the dogs up for comparative examination of head
  - Remember this is a head breed.
- Ask steward for ages. ETS are very slow to mature.
  - Most ETS do nor get body and coat until they are 3-4 years of age
  - ETS are commonly shown as Specials until they are 6 or 7 years of age or longer
