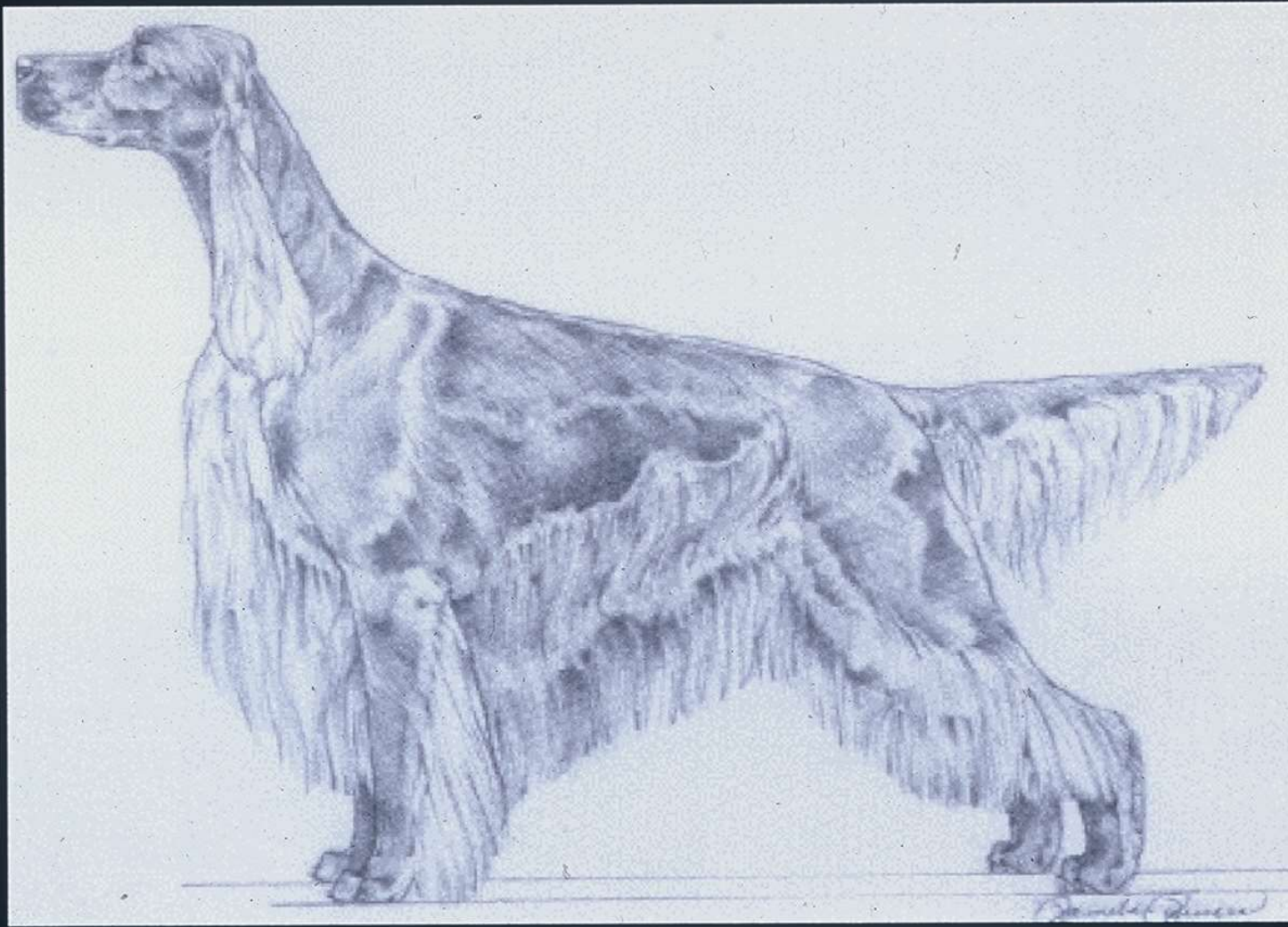

Irish Setter General Appearance

- * **Active, aristocratic bird dog**
- * **Rich red in color**
- * **Substantial and balanced, yet elegant in build**
- * **Sweet natured, trainable hunter and companion**



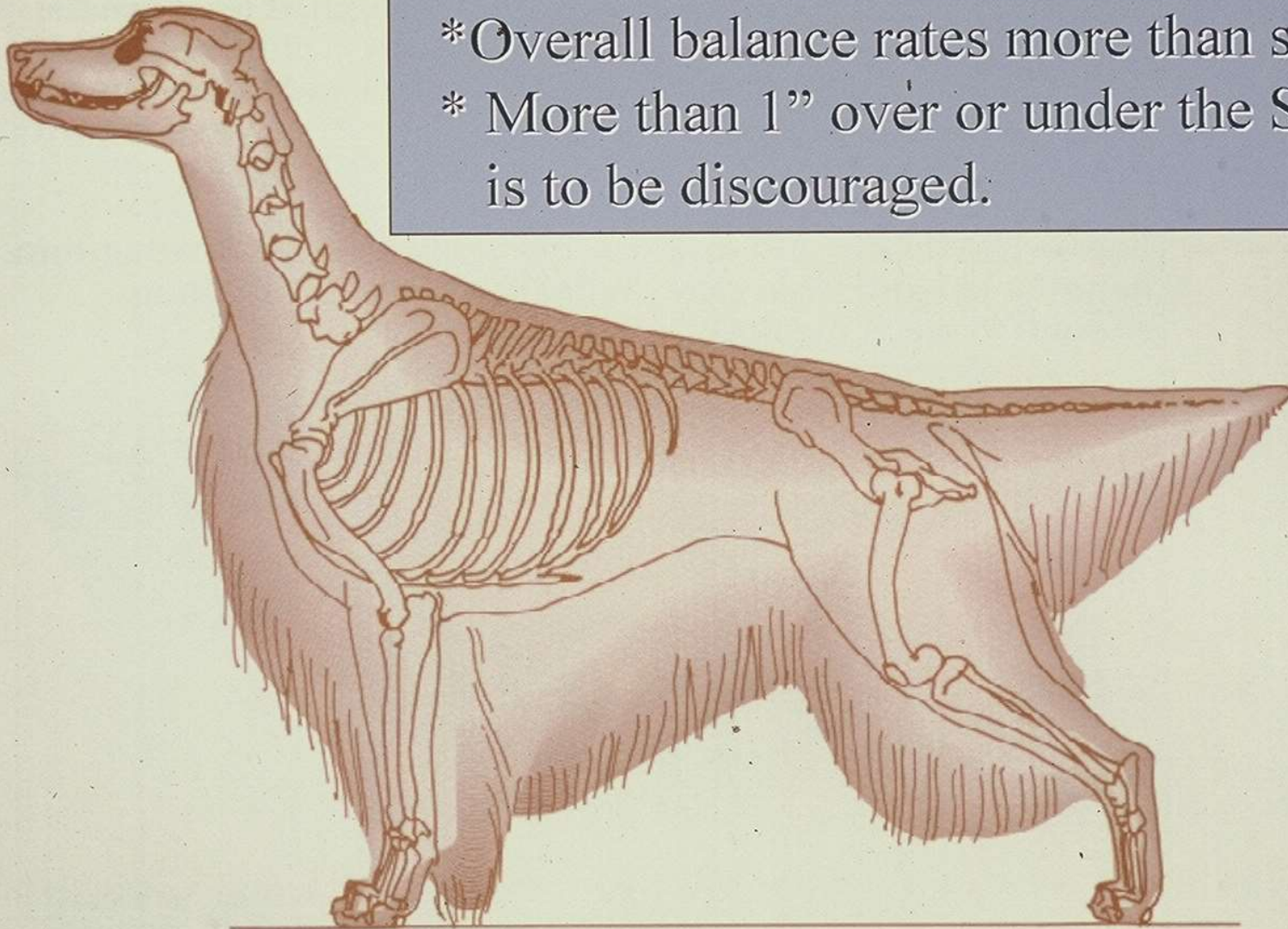
Size, Proportion, Substance

- Size:** Dog should be 27" at withers and 70 pounds.
Bitch should be 25" at withers and 60 pounds.
- Proportion:** Slightly longer than tall.
- Substance:** All legs sturdy with plenty of bone.



Skeletal Structure

- * Overall balance rates more than size alone.
- * More than 1" over or under the Standard is to be discouraged.



Head: Long and lean with delicate chiseling

Eyes: Soft expression, alert, almond shaped, medium size

Ears: Set back and low, leather thin, almost reach the nose

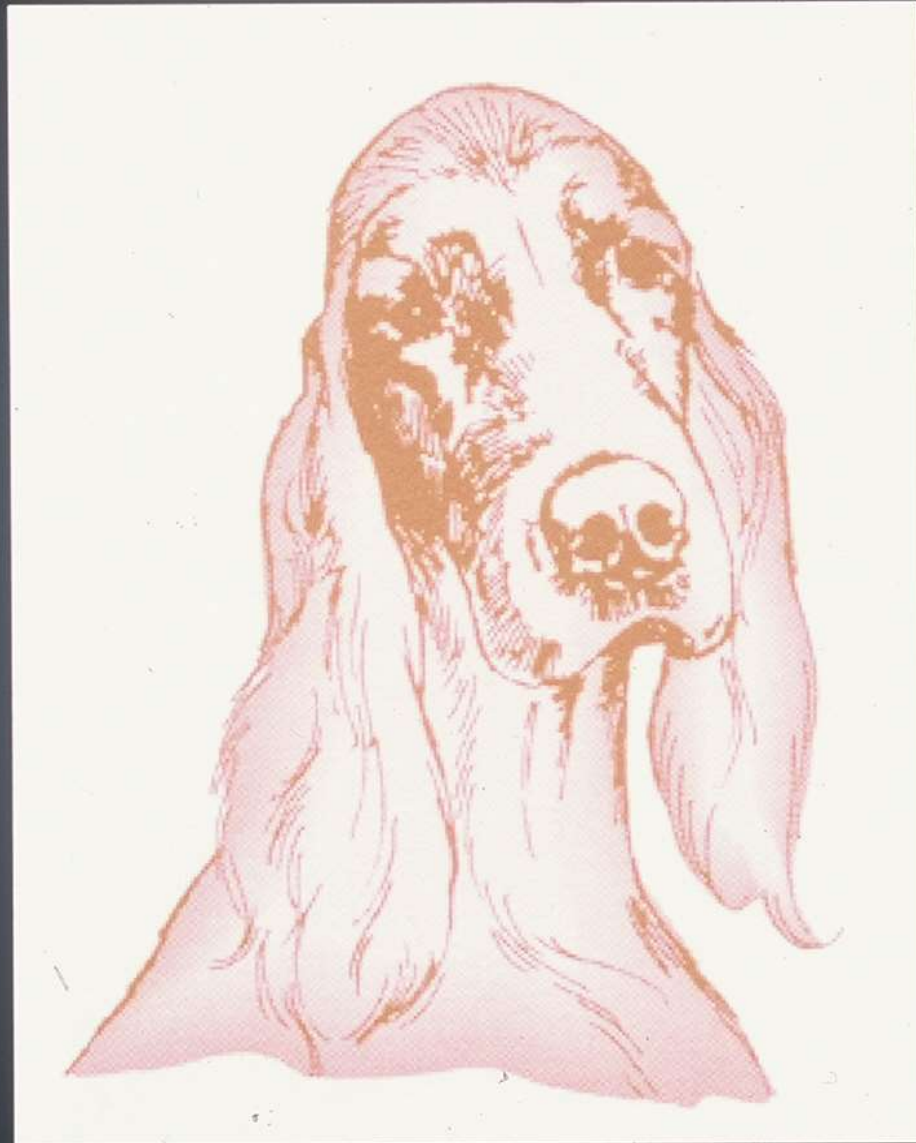


Proper Head Configuration





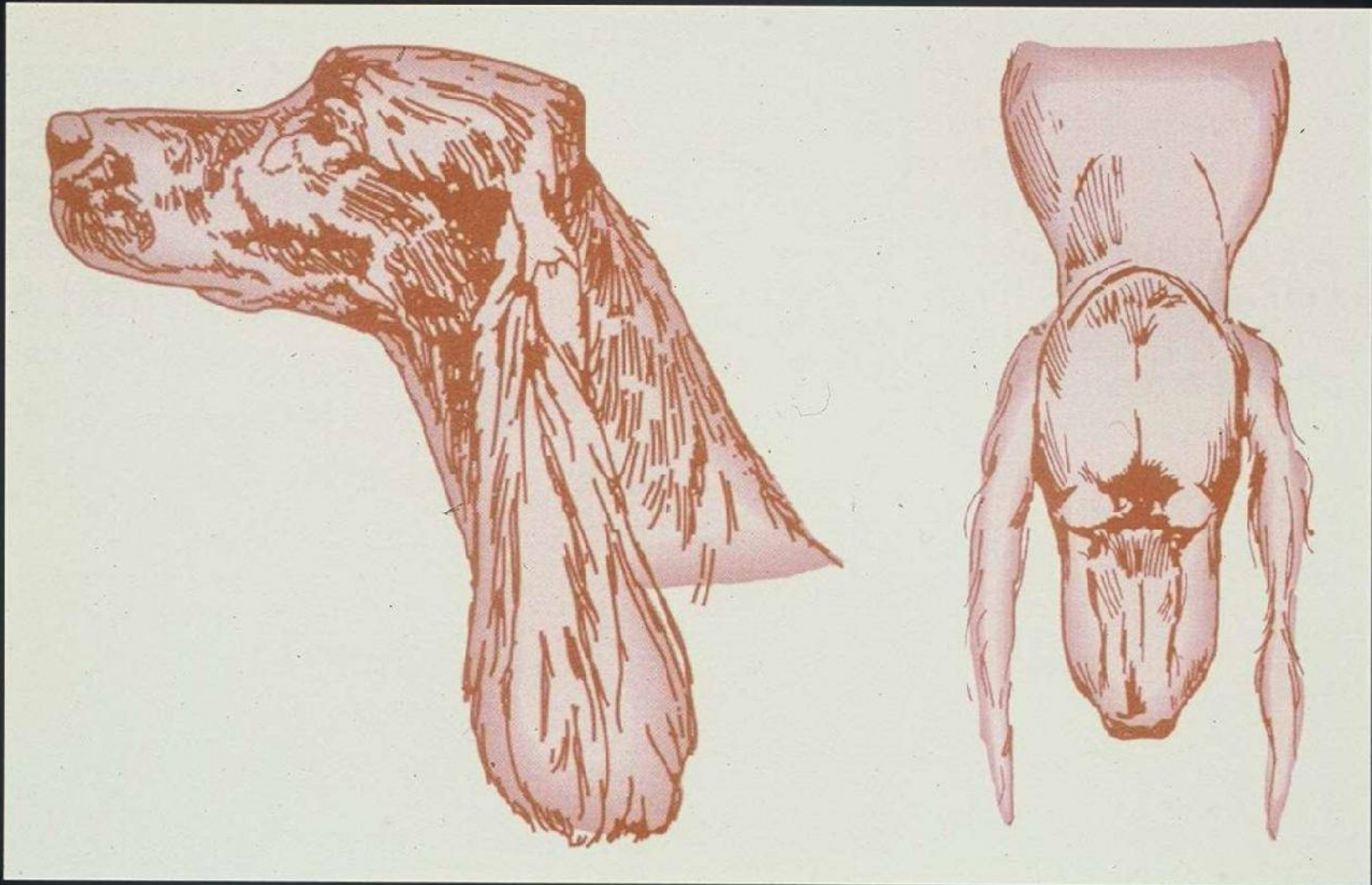

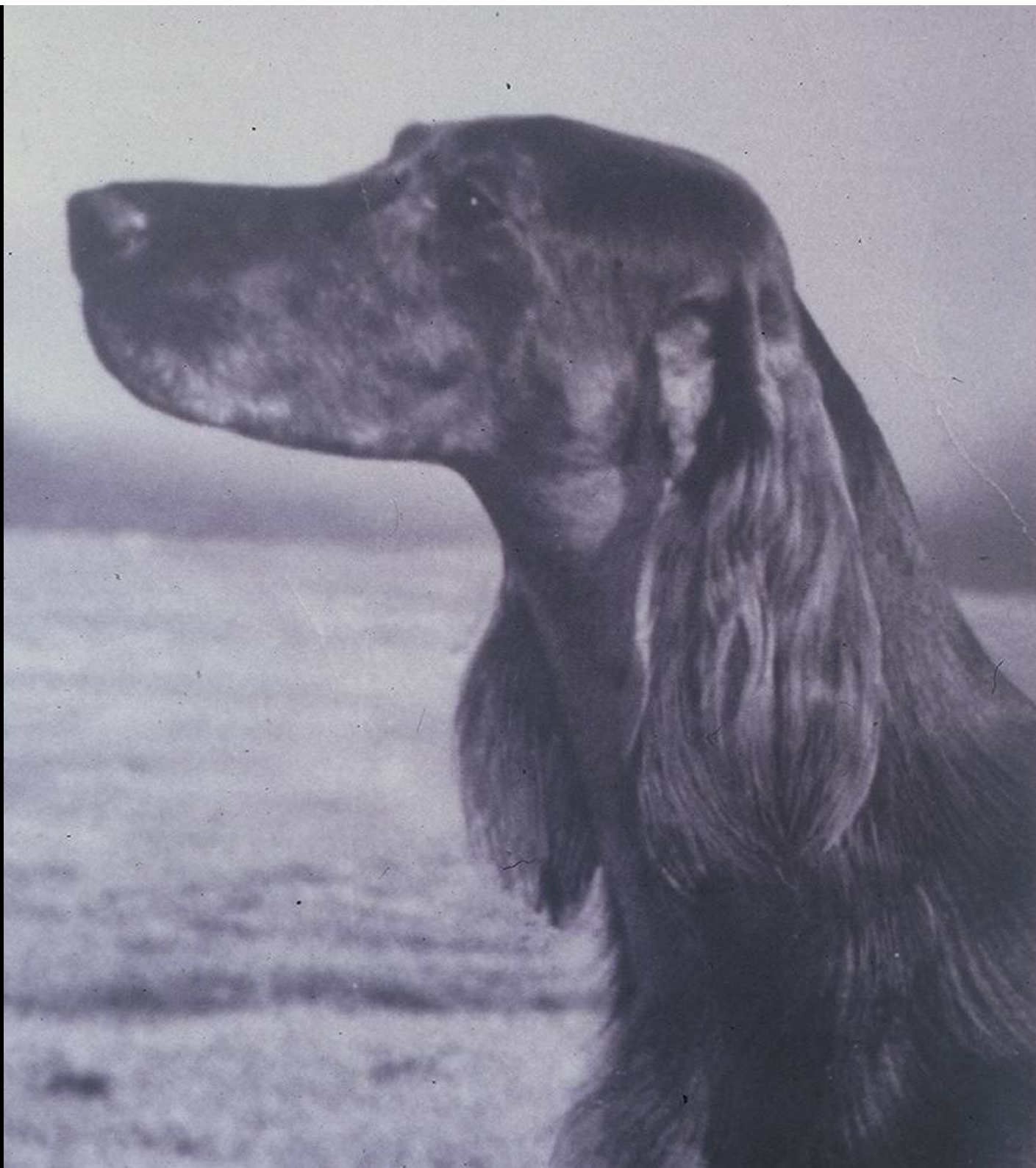




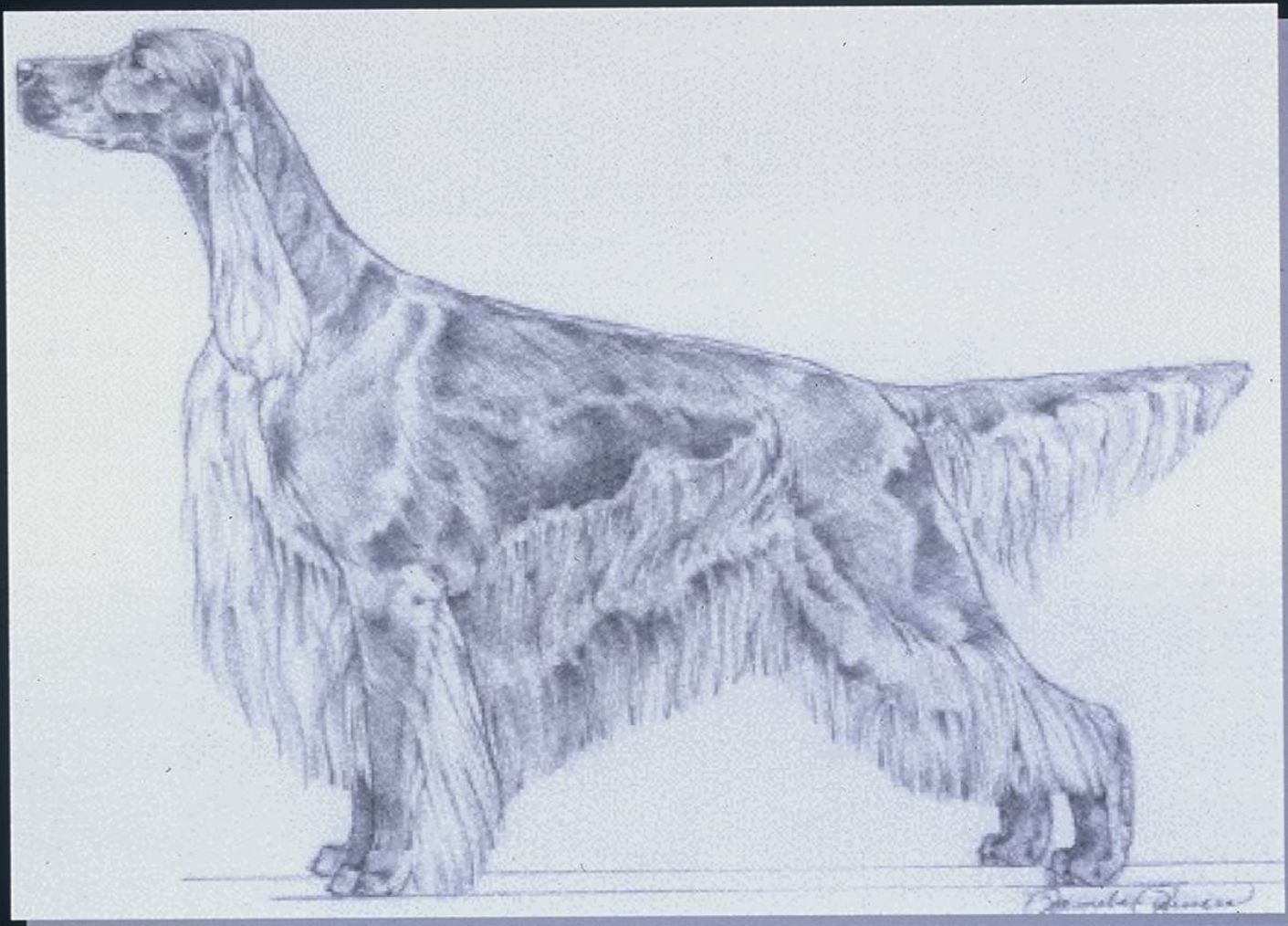


Proper Head Configuration

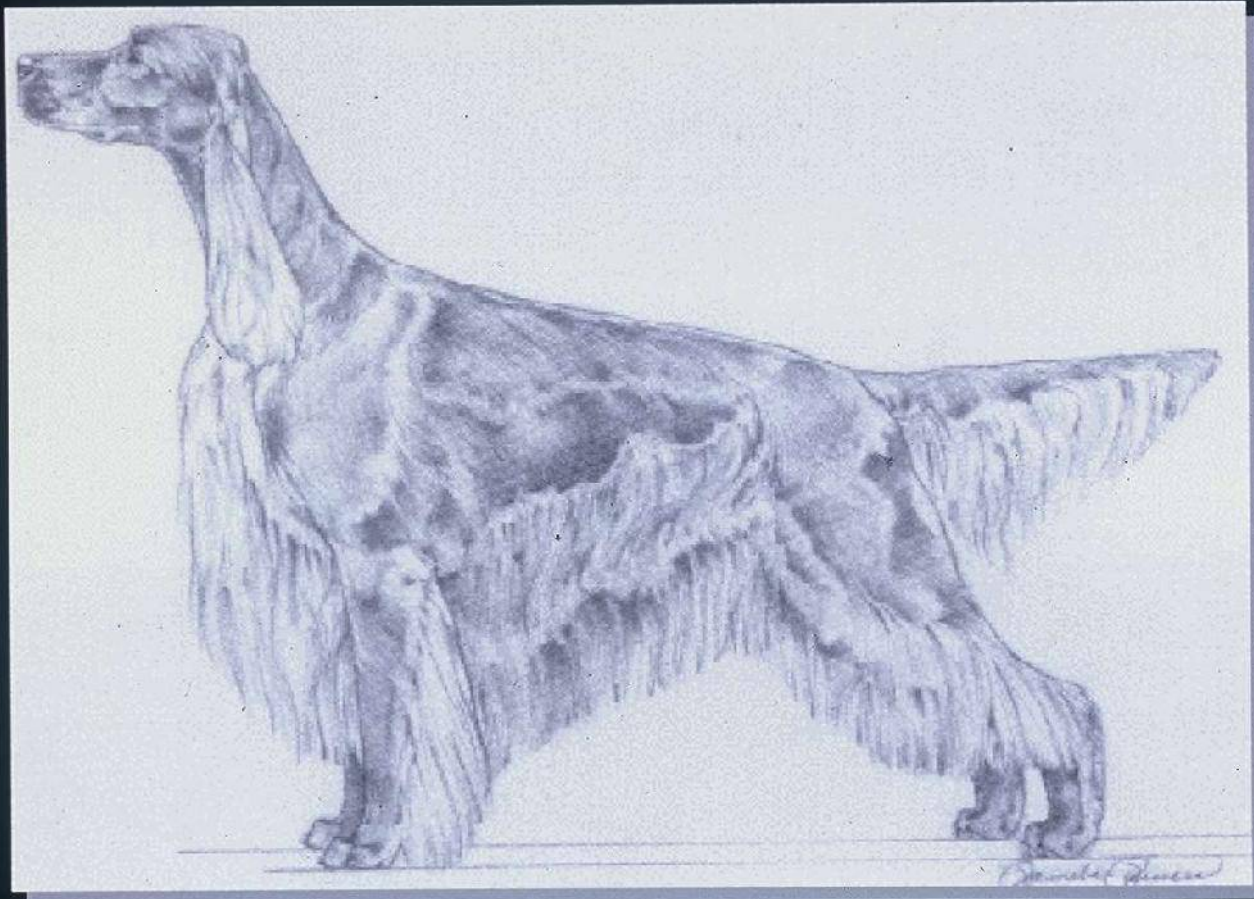




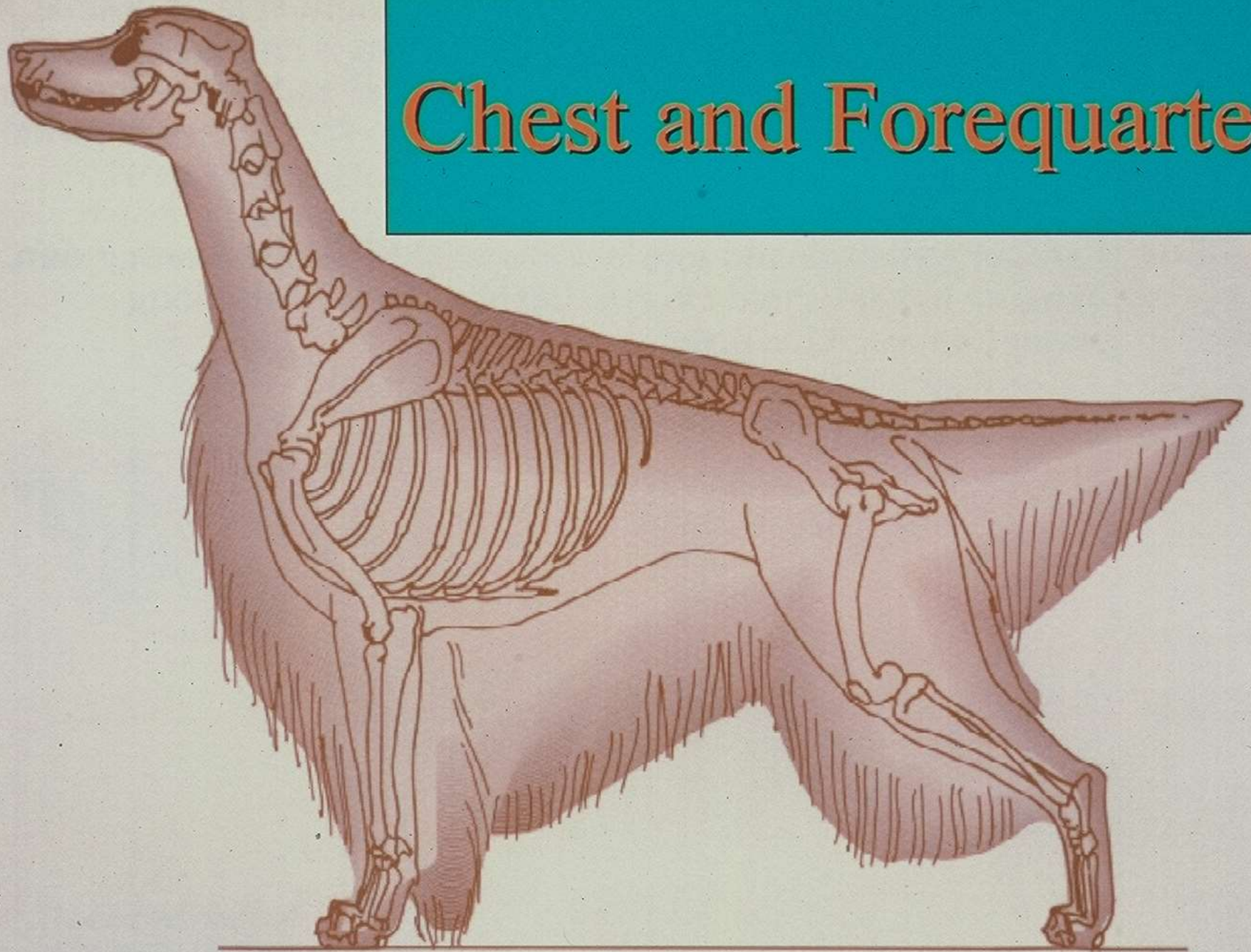
Neck



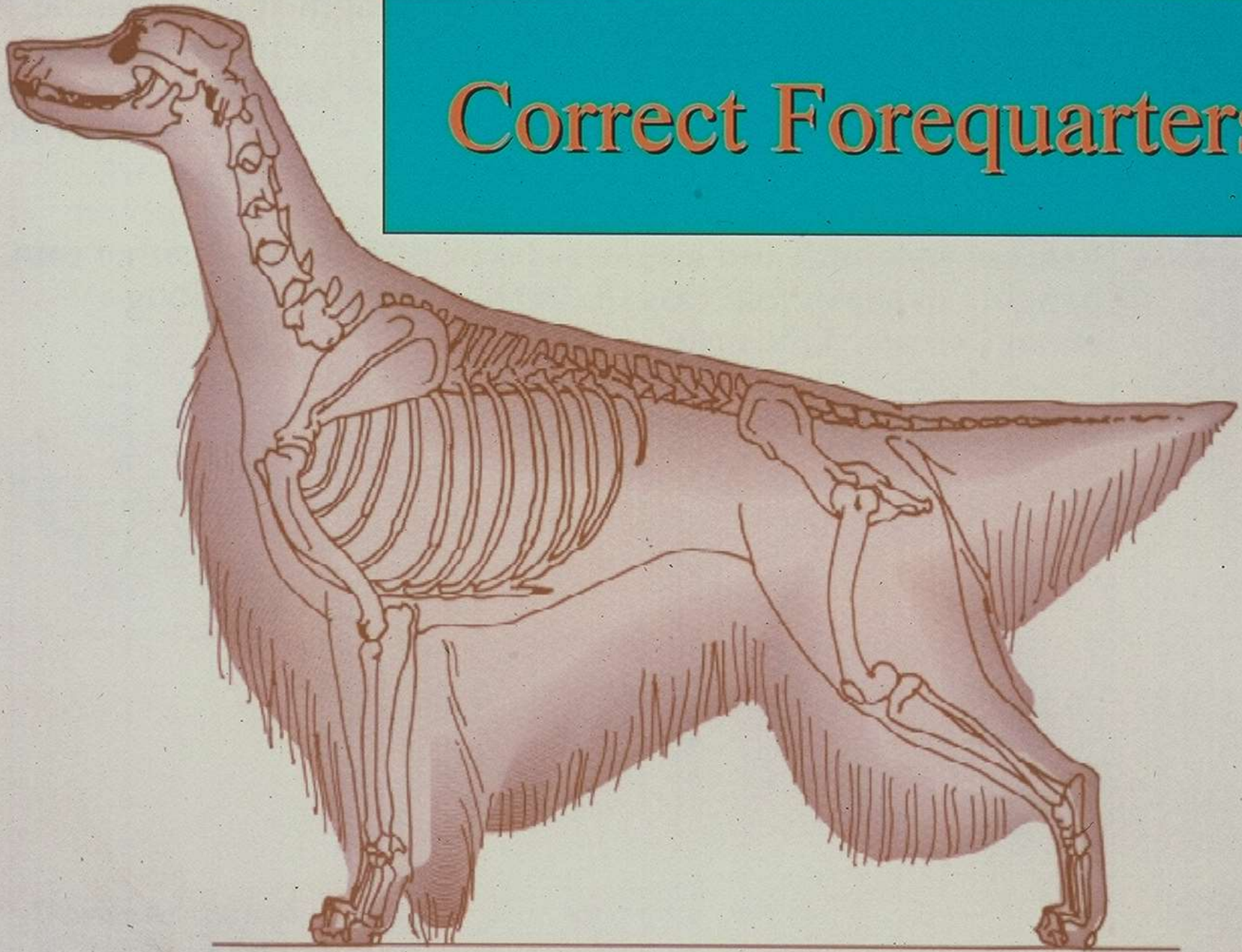
Topline, Body and Tail



Chest and Forequarters

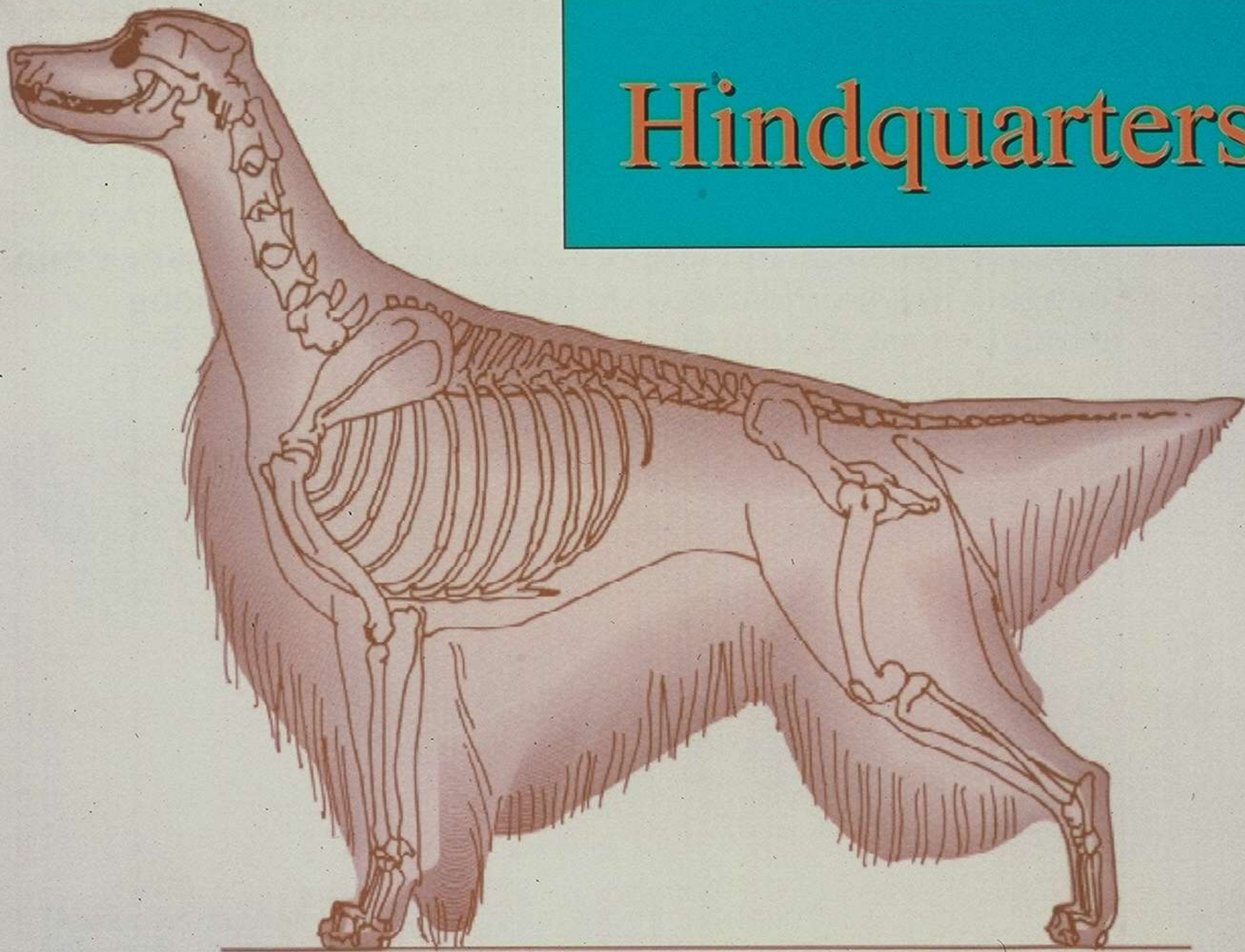


Correct Forequarters



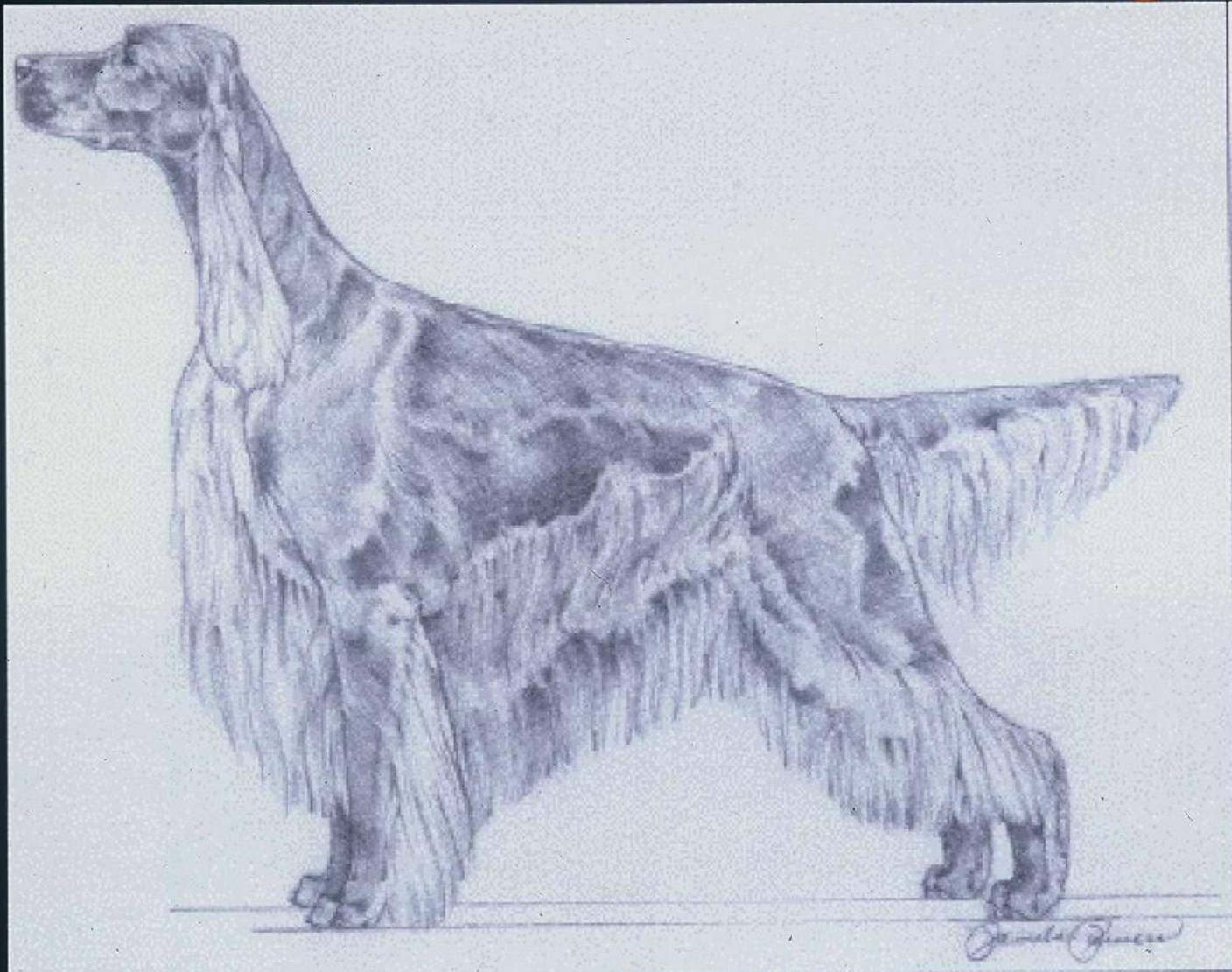


Hindquarters

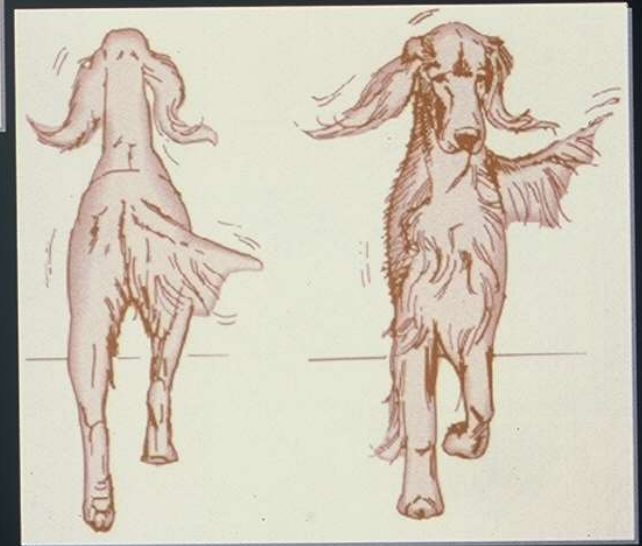
