
A Horizontal Line on Top of Nose Should Go Across the Middle of Eyes and Touch the Tip of the Alert Ear




Vertical Line Down Middle of Face




Head Four Equal Parts




To Have a Round Head You Must Have a Chin




Put All Views of the Head Together = HEAD ROUND











Nose set in line with middle eyes and tip of alert ears.

Eyes Dark, Large, Round and Soft










Head Wrinkles Important to Expression




Muzzle is flat in profile




Muzzle – Short, Blunt, Square but not upfaced


Correct Round Head Fits into a square

Pinched Muzzle Triangular Head Lippy Muzzle Lacking in underjaw






Bite Slightly Undershot



Neck of sufficient length to carry large head proudly










Body - Short and Cobby, Chest Wide, Well Ribbed Up, Back Level From Withers to High Tail Set


measured from point of shoulder to rump and withers to ground




Tail Curled Tightly Over the Hip Double Curl Perfection




Set High and Tight to Body



Double Curl But Low Set




Moderately Low Set But Tight to Body

through or under tail)








HINDQUARTERS

Looking from the top of the Pug Rear is as wide as the Shoulders









Incorrect Pacing

Even Tempered, Often a Clown in the Ring and at Home


