JUDGING THE SCOTTISH TERRIER 6 Key Elements of Scottish Terrier Type

<u>Harsh outer coat & dense undercoat</u> - to protect dog from injury & inclement weather.



Long head - in proportion to the size of the dog, skull medium width, good fill under eye, good strength of muzzle with sizable teeth.




Heavy bone and substance - for the size of the dog.

Low to ground - deep brisket ending below the elbow. Compact from withers to tail, however, longer from point of chest to point of rump. Obvious forechest and obvious rear shelf add to length.



<u>Movement</u> - Gait is unique to the breed with forelegs that incline slightly on acceleration while rear legs move true. A correctly built Scottish Terrier should cover ground well despite his short leg.



<u>Temperament</u> - shows true terrier temperament, no shyness or timidity.
